

Clinics Across Greece

Over the past 25 months, Hellas Lacrosse has conducted 28 clinics with over 1600 total attendees for both students, active PE teachers and college PE majors.

Locations include Trikala, home to TEFAA ~ College of Physical Education, Larissa, Thessaloniki and Athens, including upper primary through secondary schools and universities. We were invited to introduce lacrosse at the 22 Annual International Congress on PE & Sports at the Olympic Museum in Thessaloniki in April 2019. the session was well attanded and the on-field clinic that followed was overflowing with enthusiasm for a new sport!



With an eye toward the future, Hellas Lacrosse has established roots in mainland Greece in an environment that has sports facilities along with interested students and teachers. Partnerships have been established with key private schools in Trikala, Larissa, Thessaloniki & Athens to conduct clinics in their PE classes.



Hosted Exchange

Hellas Lacrosse sponsored an exchange program and invited 2 athletes to train and compete in the US during July 2018. Eleni Tsianta and Yiota Kostantinous attended the Maryland camp, trained with elite level US club teams, took the field with CCLax at 2 top tournaments, and ended both scrimmages with the England U19 teams in a tie. Upon returning to Trikala, Eleni has been leading and conducting clinics at Hellas Lacrosse affiliated schools.

Goals

Create a network of affiliated schools to establish a foundation from which to grow the game.

2018 Establish a governance structure that will support the growth of the game.

Identify and sponsor interested athletes to participate in a potential exchange program.

Double the number of clinics and students participating - establish a interschool competition.

2019 Establish the nucleus for a women's team to participate in international competition. Identity and sponsor interested athletes in established exchange programs.

Secure sponsorship to hire a coach to live in Greece & teach across the network of schools

Continue clinics at partner schools. Establish relationships with local athletic clubs to offer lacrosse.

Expand inter school competition and introduce separate boys / girls training, including equipment. Add a second coach, expand sponsorship to establish exchange program for both girls and boys. Add 2000 more introductions.

Replicate what Hellas Lacrosse has done in the original four cities.

Develop interschool competition to full field matches for both boys and girls
Expand the sponsorship to include a third coach. Extend program to additional cities in Greece.
Establish a structure forfielding teams, both men's and women's, for international competition.


